

WELCOME TO NON LEAGUE DAY 2026



Saturday is Non-League Day 2026, an opportunity for football fans all over the country to sample the delights that the non-League game has to offer.

It was set up by James Doe in 2010 as a social media experiment, after being inspired by a pre-season trip to Devon to watch Queens Park Rangers play at Tavistock, who now ply their trade right here in the Southern League Division One South.

It has now grown to become an annual part of the football calendar, backed by Premier League and Football League clubs, MPs, celebrities, media organisations, charities and, most importantly, the non-League clubs themselves and the fans who turn up on the day.

Always scheduled to coincide with an international break, Non-League Day provides a platform for clubs to promote the importance of affordable, volunteer-led community football while giving fans across the country the chance to show support for their local non-League side.

Many non-League clubs are almost exclusively volunteer run, with money taken at the turnstiles often funding thriving youth set-ups, projects and facilities which are of benefit to the whole community.

The level of skill on offer at non-League grounds might not be the same as that at the top levels of the game, but there are other sides to the experience from which the smaller club will always win hands down.

The vast majority of games still kick off at 3pm, admission prices are realistic, you can often stand (and drink!) anywhere in the ground and will always be guaranteed a warm welcome by people who run their clubs for a love of the game.

In addition, the day is also used to promote the fantastic work of Prostate Cancer UK and help spread their important message that one in eight men will get prostate cancer – early diagnosis saves lives!

BERKHAMSTED v GOSPORT BOROUGH

Gosport Borough held their nerve to secure a big win last Saturday and keep their play-off ambitions alive.

A goal in first half stoppage time from Brad Tarbuck proved to be the difference against high-flying Poole Town.

"We were probably the most solid I've seen us all season," Tarbuck told us. "This has been coming over the past few weeks; it was an excellent all-round performance with everyone playing their part.

"The fact that I scored what proved to be the decisive goal makes it feel so much sweeter for me, but the main thing was that we picked up the three points to stay in touch with the top five.

"I'd say that it's been a roller-coaster season for us so far. Finding consistency has been our biggest downfall, but to find ourselves still in contention for the play-offs at the end of March gives us something to really push for.

"I've always said it's how you end and the last few games have been positive, so there are some good signs as we go into the final stretch.

"It's what they call the 'business end' of the season now where every point matters. It's going to be a tight finish in the race to make the play-offs and I am looking forward to being part of it.

"Having played in this League for a while, this is definitely the strongest that I have ever seen it. There are so many good players involved and I'm sure that it will only get even more competitive.

"As far as we are concerned, the aim is to finish as high up the table as we can, whether that's in the play-off places or not.

"Recent games have seen us prove what we are about and that we can compete against anyone at this level. It gives us the confidence going forward as we look for a positive end to the season.

"Personally I just want to finish the season healthy and to be able to help the team finish as high as possible."

Sitting just three points off the top five with three wins from their last four games, Tarbuck and his team-mates face a trip to a Berkhamsted outfit who are level with them on 57 points.

"Every game becomes more important than the last at this stage of the season," he added. "It's another big game for both clubs; we'll be looking to take the confidence gained from Saturday's win into it and see what happens."

The home side go into the game on the back of two successive 1-0 wins as they followed up their triumph over Gloucester City with an away win at Havant & Waterlooville last weekend to make it four wins from their last five outings.

It's been another productive week for leaders, Walton & Hersham, with two wins, albeit they had to work hard for their single-goal victory at Tiverton Town last weekend. On Saturday they host a Dorchester Town who are desperate for the points for very different reasons. A victory would see the home side break through the 90-point barrier by the end of March.

Behind them the rest of the leading pack are battling to find some consistency. Gloucester City followed up their home defeat at the hands of Uxbridge by winning 6-0 at Tiverton Town on Tuesday. They host an in-form Plymouth Parkway in what is sure to be a keenly-contested affair.

Meanwhile Farnham Town were held to a home draw by Basingstoke Town last weekend before succumbing at the aforementioned Plymouth Parkway during the week. They host a Chertsey Town outfit who are clinging on to the last play-off spot. A 1-0 loss at Gosport Borough followed by a 2-2 draw at Yate Town has been the order of the day for Poole Town this week as they prepare to host mid-table Bracknell Town.

A draw at Hungerford Town and home reverse at the hands of Walton & Hersham leave Sholing just outside of the play-off places as they face a trip to Weymouth, who are looking to secure their status at this level.

Down at the bottom, Tiverton Town host Hungerford Town who go into the game just inside the bottom four. Taunton Town are on the road to Basingstoke Town, who are still involved in the relegation mix as they sit four points clear of the bottom four.

Following their hard-earned draw with Poole Town, it's another home game for Yate Town as they take on mid-table Hanwell Town. Sitting just above the drop zone are Evesham United who hit the road for Havant & Waterlooville, who seem safe in mid-table in what has been a roller-coaster season for them.

Elsewhere, it's been a positive campaign for Uxbridge who have reached the 50-point mark following their come-from-behind victory at Gloucester City last weekend. They host a Wimborne Town outfit who are looking to halt a slide that has taken them into the bottom half of the table.

BARWELL v KETTERING TOWN

A run of just one defeat from their last 11 games has thrust Kettering Town back into play-off contention.

They sit a couple of points and a couple of places off the top five going into the weekend fixtures, but were left frustrated on Tuesday evening when they were held to a goalless home draw by Banbury United.

"We came off the pitch disappointed," admitted skipper, George Forsyth. "It was a chance for us to get into the play-off places but we were unable to take it.

"The conditions were difficult out there, but we're not using that as an excuse. The second half especially we never got going. We had little spells here and there, but we were never able to get hold of the game.

"We found ourselves up against defensively-strong and well-organised opponents, but we have to be able to find a way to win, especially at home, and we were unable to do that. The disappointment comes from within because we've worked so

hard to put ourselves into this position and we are desperate to take that next step and move back into the top five.

"At this stage of the season there's no time to dwell on things too much; we have to keep working and be ready for the next challenge that comes our way.

"The run that we have been on has given us a chance. The Gaffer has signed some quality players who have helped to raise the standards and everyone within the group has responded.

"We have a couple of different ways of playing and we all know our roles and responsibilities and have stuck to the plan that has been given to us.

"Of course, we want to be in those play-off places; it's a target that we have set ourselves and we are determined to achieve it."

Saturday sees The Poppies hit the road to face a Barwell side who are desperate for the points to escape the clutches of the bottom four.

Barwell go into the game three places off the foot of the table, but only a couple of points off safety. They suffered a disappointing

4-2 home reverse at the hands of fellow strugglers, AFC Sudbury, last weekend as part of a run of five straight defeats.

This is one of a number of games that has a bearing at both ends of the table and as such it promises to be a hard-fought encounter.

Despite conceding a late equaliser to draw 2-2 at Real Bedford on Tuesday evening, Harborough Town remain in top spot and they will be looking to strengthen their position as they return to home action for the visit of mid-table Bury Town.

Below them, second placed Spalding United, who were held to a 1-1 draw at St. Ives in their last outing, also have home advantage as they take on a Bromsgrove Sporting outfit who are battling to keep their heads above the relegation zone.

There's a mouth-watering third against fourth clash as Real Bedford take on Halesowen Town, who arrive on the back of a 3-1 victory over Bury Town. Occupying the final play-off spot are Quorn, who will be looking to respond in the right way to their 3-1 loss at Kettering Town last weekend as they take on a Stratford Town side who have found some form this week with successive wins in which they have scored a total of seven goals

Just outside of the play-off places are Redditch United who go to

bottom club, Royston Town, who are now 12 points from safety. Also in the bottom four are AFC Sudbury who made a return to winning ways last weekend with a 4-2 triumph at Barwell, giving recently-installed manager, David Hennessey, something to cheer about as he prepares to host an Alvechurch side who are still involved in the battle to avoid the drop.

**FROME TOWN
v DIDCOT TOWN**

There's just no stopping Frome Town. Tuesday's 4-1 away win at Falmouth Town was their 24th League game without defeat, a run that stretches back to the end of October.

92 points and just defeats from 36 Division One South games tells its own story as they close in on the title.

One of the heroes of their successful campaign is George Dowling who has played a key role with another impressive display.

"It was a great team performance on Tuesday night in very difficult conditions," he told us. "I thought we played excellently. Falmouth isn't an easy place to go to, especially on a Tuesday night, but to a man we were unbelievable again.

"Collectively we created so many chances and never really looked troubled or like we would concede, but when they did manage to score, we quickly bounced back and added a fourth goal to kill the game off.

"From a personal stand point, I was really happy to put in another player of the match performance, but as long as we're winning that's all that matters to me.

"I feel as though I've had a great season personally up until this point. I signed for Frome Town with one intention and that was to win this league and get this football club back to where it belongs.

"The fans deserve that more than anything else. In our changing room I'm one of the more senior lads and I've tried to carry out that responsibility as best I can by leading by example and implementing the experience I have into the younger lads and team itself.

"I think that no matter what the level, to win a league is huge and we've put ourselves in a position where it's down to us to do so. I'm so excited to play the last six games and hopefully achieve something as a team we set out to do. Mathematically I believe it's six points for us to win the league and we'll be doing everything possible to make that happen.

"Division One South this season has been so entertaining to play in; there are so many competitive teams. If you look at the table, there's three or four teams fighting to get into the play-off places and at the other end of the table, there are a number of teams fighting to avoid relegation.

"There's been no easy games this season and no result has been a given, so many times we've heard Frome will drop points here or there and we've gone about our business very professionally. It's not been easy at times, but we have got the job done.

"The only target for myself for the rest of the season is to help the team win this league. I don't set personal targets as such, this year was about one thing and one thing only.

"As a collective it's the same; we want to win the title and every player is hungry to do that. A few added bonuses would be for Archie Ferris to finish league top goal scorer, Kyle [Phillips] and the back three to get the most clean sheets and also to progress in the local cup - a double would be the club's first in its history, so we all have one eye on that as well.

"Selfishly, Goal of the Season would be quite nice too, but we'll wait and see on that one!"

It's a return to home action for Frome on Saturday as they play host to a Didcot Town side who find themselves in the lower half of the table.

A fortnight ago they were able to beat in-form Hartpury FC 3-1 but they were brought back down to earth in their last game as they lost 2-0 at home to Bristol Manor Farm and that has been the story of their season as they have failed to find the necessary levels of consistency.

For Bishops Cleeve, Saturday brings a home encounter with Mousehole AFC, who have been dragged into a battle in the lower reaches of the table.

Sandwiched in between are Winchester City, who grabbed a stoppage time leveller to draw 2-2 at Sporting Club Inkberrow in their last outing. They face a home game against bottom club, Tavistock AFC.

Having fallen to a 3-0 home reverse at the hands of Falmouth Town last weekend, Hartpury FC hit the road to Swindon Supermarine as they look to keep their play-off ambitions alive. Down at the bottom and with Tavistock AFC heading to

Winchester City, one place above them, Bashley suffered a late home loss at the hands of Bideford AFC last Saturday as they managed to pull back to 2-2 from two goals down only to concede in stoppage time. They follow it up with a 2-2 home draw with Swindon Supermarine on Tuesday to leave them nine points off safety. They take on Melksham Town, who are perched just above the relegation trap door.

Also in the bottom four, Brixham AFC's form has picked up considerably in recent weeks and they will be looking to make home advantage count against mid-table Westbury United. Falling back into the bottom four on goal difference following their 1-0 home reverse at the hands of Malvern Town in midweek, Willand Rovers face a big Devon derby at Bideford AFC, who are just two points above them.

Elsewhere, Bristol Manor Farm are heading towards mid-table as they host a Sporting Club Inkberrow outfit who sit a few places above them following a solid first-ever season at this level. Falmouth Town still have some work to do in order to pull themselves away from danger and they will be looking to make home advantage count when they meet mid-table Larkhall Athletic.

**BIGGLESWADE FC
v MARLOW**

The battle to make the top five in the Pitching In Southern League Division One Central is really hotting up.

Biggleswade FC gave their goal difference a boost last weekend as they hit eight goals without reply against bottom club, AFC Dunstable.

Weighing in with half of the goals was Temi Akinbusoye.

"It was a really professional performance," the four-goal hero told us. "This season has seen us on the wrong end of results against clubs in the lower reaches of the table, so we knew that our attitude and approach had to be right for this one."

"The facts that we were able to maintain high standards throughout was great and we were able to reap the rewards from it."

"I have mixed emotions about my own performance. Whilst it was great to hit four goals, I missed a number of other chances, which was frustrating, so there is still plenty of room for me to improve."

"That said, it was the first time that I have scored that many goals in senior football, so hopefully I won't have to wait too long for the next one!"

"I do feel that generally I have under-achieved in terms of goals scored this season. I'm on 12 now, but I feel that I probably should have had double that amount based on chances."

"But, if I can contribute the goals to help us have a positive end to the season where we achieve our objectives, I will be happy."

"It has been a positive season in terms of my development; I've improved my pressing, become more aggressive and front-footed, and become more reliable in holding the ball up and linking play."

"The management have spoken to me numerous times about sticking to my strengths, one of them being making runs in behind and helping the team move up the pitch to create chances for myself and the team, so there has been definite progress in my overall game."

"As a team it's nice to be in amongst the leading pack. There have been times, particularly with the squad we have, where we've lacked consistency and dropped points we shouldn't have."

"It would have put us in a stronger position within the play-off places, but we are in there fighting and we would have taken that going into the season."

"It means that we have an exciting run-in to look forward to. You want to be aspiring to achieve something that this stage of the season, rather than the campaign just petering out. We're ready for the challenge and our aim is to pick up as many points as we can and focus on getting our own house in order before looking at what's happening elsewhere."

"This is such a competitive League; it always has been and anyone is more than capable of beating anyone. There are unexpected results most weeks, to be honest, and that says a lot about how tough it is."

So, what are the aims and targets for the weeks ahead?

"Personally, I just want to keep improving," he added. "I'm in a good environment where you have senior players who are willing to help you, alongside a good management team who are more than willing to support you too."

"Ultimately, I want to score more goals and help us get to where

we want to be come the end of the season.

"The management have reiterated numerous times that our target is the play-offs and that is our focus. It's important to take every game as it comes and keep adding to our points' tally."
